THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

The 54-hole stroke play championship, was introduced as part of The R&A's drive to boost the girls' game in Great Britain and Ireland and beyond, as well as provide a pathway to the elite amateur level for leading young players.

The R&A Girls' U16 Amateur Championship attracts players from across the world and England's Rosie Bee Kim, who won the Under-12s section in 2018, took the main title with success at Enville in 2021.

In 2024, Louise Landgraf (France) won the Angela Uzielli Trophy after a hole by hole play off with Charlotte Naughton. Having tied on eight-under-par 211, Landgraf secured the win by making par on the second playoff hole, a par 5. Together, they set a new 54-hole championship record, surpassing the six-under-par score Italy's Francesca Fiorellini recorded to win the 2019 title.



HOST VENUE.



2025 HOST VENUE THE GOG MAGOG GOLF CLUB – OLD COURSE

Built on free draining chalk downland and situated just 3 miles south-east of the historic centre of Cambridge, The Gog Magog Golf Club has two stunning and very different courses.

The idea to build a golf course was put forward by the Council of Gonville and Caius College, and in 1898, W Duncan – the resident pro at Coldham’s Common – laid out a rudimentary 9-hole course. The following year, the course was extended to 18 holes and in 1901 the Gog Magog Golf Club was officially founded.

The Old Course, opened in 1901, has all the character you would expect from a course with so much history. It has great variety, great views and is a great test for all abilities.

PRIZES.

The Angela Uzielli Trophy shall be awarded to the player returning the lowest score for the 54 holes. The winner shall be The Girls' U16 Amateur Champion and shall also receive a gold medal.

A memento shall be awarded to the players in 2nd, 3rd and 4th positions.

The top 1 – 4 placed players will gain an exemption into the 2025 R&A Girls' Amateur Championship.

The Liz Pook Trophy shall be awarded to the player under 14 years of age returning the lowest score for the 54 holes.

The Fulford Trophy shall be awarded to the player under 12 years of age returning the lowest score for the 54 holes.

A memento shall be awarded to the player returning the lowest 18-hole score in each round of the Championship.



PLAYER SERVICES.

Water

Should you wish to practise outside of the official days please contact the club. They club have offered a reduced green fee of £20. Tee times are subject to availability after 10am. There is no tee time availability on Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Full practice range and short game facilities will be available at the venue with balls provided by Titleist. Practice facilities will be available from 90 minutes before the first tee time until 5.30pm on Thursday -Saturday and 1.00pm on Sunday.

MODEL LOCAL RULE G-12.

Prohibiting the use of any materials to help read the line of play for stroke from putting green.

Model Local Rule G-12 is going to be in effect at The R&A Girls' Under 16 Amateur Championship at Gog Magog.

This is a new Local Rule for R&A Amateur Championships. Please take note of the following guidance:

X During a round, **you** (and your **caddie** if you are allowed one) must **not** use **any** written, printed, electronic or digital materials to help with reading your line of play for any stroke to be made from the putting green.

This includes using your yardage book, any charts, graphs or other notes when your ball is on the putting green for the specific purpose of reading your line of play.

✓ When your ball is on the putting green, you can use your yardage book for other reasons that do not help you read the line of play such as:

- writing notes relating to the previous shot
- checking the yardage for the next hole.

⚠ You are responsible for your caddie's action during the round. You get the penalty if your caddie breaches this Rule.

SPECTATORS.

Spectators are welcome and we ask that they please follow the spectator policy.

Spectator Policy

1. You are welcome to walk on the course, keeping to the sides of fairways / semi rough. You should position yourself in a safe place not interfering with play. Keep still and quiet when a ball is being played and remember to silence your mobile device.
2. Please keep a reasonable distance from players to avoid any suggestion that you are offering advice.
3. Keep away from any ball in play. You are welcome to assist with ball spotting and searching but please avoid trampling down long grass or touching a found ball.
4. Do not carry, transport or handle a player's clubs or equipment.
5. Players should only obtain information on Rules from Referees who will be on the course. Local Rules are often different from those of the Club.
6. Anyone wishing to take photographs during the Championship must receive prior authorisation from The R&A Championship Director.
