## WOMEN IN GOLF CHARTER

The Peruvian Golf Federation fully supports the Women in Golf Charter. We are committed to encouraging the participation of women and girls at all levels of the game, including its leadership. We believe that these actions will contribute to the future of golf in the country, and we proudly support the R&A in its initiative.

Our commitment in recent years has allowed:

- Women to be part of the Board of Directors of the Federation since 2016
- A woman is a national representative before the Rules Committee of the South American Golf Federation.
- The current National Team Coach is the first woman to have worked in that position in the history of the Federation.
- The Women's Golf Commission was created and will be in charge of ensuring the development of actions for the benefit of golf.

We believe that the following actions will contribute to developing the future of women's golf in the country, and through them, we proudly support The R&A in its initiative:

- Increase the number of rounds played by women by 20% in the next four years.
- Develop a 9-hole tour of tournaments, that include social and empowering activities.
- Annually celebrate a women's golf week that allows to carry out a series of activities, including a simultaneous tournament involving players from all golf clubs in the country.
- Support the participation of national players in highly competitive events, allowing them to achieve a position within the Top 50 of the World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR).
- Increase the number of active Ladies by 10% in the first year, to reach 25% in 4 years.

As a National Governing Body, we are in a unique position to work alongside our affiliated clubs and their memberships to define strategies and find paths to attract and retain woman into golf to increase the percentage of female golfers in the country.
