

# **ADDITIONAL LOCAL RULES (FINAL)**

In addition to 2023 The R&A Local Rules and Terms of Competition Hard Card, the following Additional Local Rules apply to the 2023 Women's Amateur Asia Pacific:

Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule is two penalty strokes.

### I. Out of Bounds (Rule 18.2)

- Defined by fences to the right of Hole 1, 16, left of Hole 4 and behind Holes 9, 15.
- Defined by white stakes and lines that surround the driving range to the right of Holes 10 and 18
- Defined by the outside edge of the cart path/bridge (indicated by white stakes) to the right of Hole 17.
- On or beyond the maintenance road (indicated by white stakes) to the left of Holes 10, 11 and to the right of 17 Green.

# 2. Penalty Areas (Rule 17)

**Dropping Zone for Yellow Penalty Area - Hole 13:** If a ball is in the yellow penalty area on Hole 13, including when it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found came to rest in the penalty area, the player may proceed under Rule 17 or, as an additional option, drop a ball under penalty of one stroke in the dropping zone provided on the front left of the teeing area.

# 3. Abnormal Course Conditions (Including Immovable Obstructions)

- Stakes and wires supporting trees (but no free relief is available from the tree itself).
- Storm drains and mats adjoining cart paths are treated as part of the cart path.
- Individual storm drains.
- Control boxes and gravel surroundings on the left of Hole 18 is a single immovable obstruction.
- Edging grooves around putting greens, but relief is only available if a ball lies in or touches a groove or a groove interferes with the area of intended swing. Ball in general area Rule 16.1b applies. Ball on putting green Rule 16.1d applies.

# 4. Sandy Native Area

The sandy native area (with plants growing inside) behind the bunkers on the right of Hole 16 is not a bunker but a part of the general area.

# 5. Temporary Immovable Obstructions

Model Local Rule F-23 is in effect. TIOs include, but are not limited to tents, scoreboards, television towers and advertising boards at tees (advertising boards elsewhere are movable obstructions). In addition:

- Adjoining TIOs are deemed to be one TIO (such as the TIOs at tees). TIO edges will be defined and/or extended with white broken lines where necessary.
- All TIOs have an either side option. Either side relief is restricted to line of sight relief only and is not available when the player chooses to operate under Rule 16.1.

## 6. Prohibiting Use of Caddies

Model Local Rule H-1.1 is in effect. A player must not have a caddie during the round.

# 7. Prohibiting Use of Clubs Longer than 46 Inches

Model Local Rule G-10 is in effect. In making a stroke, the player must not use a club, except for a putter, which exceeds 46 inches in length.

#### **Additional Points:**

- Holes I and IO Tees For the purposes of Rule 5.3a, the 1st and 10th tees are defined by the area beyond the WAAP archway close to the teeing area.
- Players' Toilets Near tees 2, 3, 4, 7 and behind greens 1, 2, 6, 7, 15 and 17.
- Returning Scorecard The player has returned the scorecard when she has exited the door of the Scoring Office.
- Play-Off Hole 9 repeated until a winner emerges.
- Result The competition has closed when the Trophy has been presented to the winner at the trophy presentation.



# **R&A CHAMPIONSHIPS AND MATCHES**

#### LOCAL RULES and TERMS OF COMPETITON

The following Local Rules and Terms of Competition, together with any additions or amendments published by The R&A at the golf course, will apply to all Championships and International Matches run by The R&A.

For the full text of any Local Rule referenced below, please refer to the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf effective January 2023 and the Clarifications updated quarterly by The R&A, available at www.randa.org.

Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty (loss of hole in match play or two penalty strokes in stroke play).

## 1 Out of Bounds (Rule 18.2)

- 1a) A ball is out of bounds when it is beyond any wall defining a boundary.
- 1b) A ball that is played from one side of a road which is defined as out of bounds and comes to rest on the other side of that road is out of bounds. This is true even if the ball comes to rest on another part of the course that is in bounds for other holes.
- 1c) Closed gates attached to boundary walls and fences are part of the boundary object. Relief is not allowed from such a gate under Rules 15.2 or 16.1. An open gate is not treated as part of the boundary object and may be closed or moved to a different position.

## 2 Penalty Areas (Rule 17)

- 2a) When a penalty area adjoins a boundary, the penalty area edge extends to and coincides with the boundary.
- 2b) When a player's ball is found in or it is known or virtually certain to have come to rest in any penalty area where the ball last crossed the edge of the penalty area at a point that coincides with the boundary of the course, opposite side relief is available under Model Local Rule B-2.1.

### **Dropping Zones for Penalty Areas**

Where a dropping zone is marked for a penalty area, it is an additional option for relief under penalty of one stroke. The dropping zone is a relief area. A ball must be dropped in and come to rest in the relief area.

# 3 Abnormal Course Conditions (including Immovable Obstructions) (Rule 16)

# 3a) Ground Under Repair

- (1) Any area bounded by a white line or a white dotted line, including spectator crossing points where marked.
- (2) Any area of damaged ground (e.g. caused by crowd or vehicle movement) that is considered by a referee to be abnormal.
- (3) Grass covered cable trenches.
- (4) French drains (stone-filled drainage ditches).
- (5) Seams of cut turf; Model Local Rule F-7 is in effect.
- (6) Yardage painted lines or dots on the putting green or in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less are to be treated as ground under repair from which relief is available under Rule 16.1. Interference does not exist if yardage painted lines or dots only interfere with the player's stance.

# 3b) Immovable Obstructions

- (1) White lined areas and the immovable obstruction they tie into are treated as a single abnormal course condition.
- (2) Landscaped garden areas and everything growing in them that are surrounded by an immovable obstruction are treated as a single abnormal course condition.
- (3) Mats that are secured and all ramps covering cables.
- (4) Roads or paths surfaced with woodchip or mulch. Individual pieces of woodchip are loose impediments.

#### 3c) Embedded Ball

Rule 16.3 is modified in this way: No free relief is allowed for a ball embedded in the stacked turf face above a bunker.

# **4 Immovable Obstructions Close to Putting Greens**

Model Local Rule F-5.1 is in effect.

## **5 Integral Objects**

The following are integral objects from which free relief is not allowed:

- 5a) Bunker liners in their intended position.
- 5b) Wires, cables, wrappings or other objects where they are closely attached to trees or other permanent objects.
- 5c) Artificial retaining walls and pilings when located in penalty areas.

# **6 Temporary Power Lines or Cables**

Model Local Rule F-22 is in effect and is modified as follows: mats that are secured and all ramps covering cables are immovable obstructions.

## 7 Temporary Immovable Obstructions

Model Local Rule F-23, with any additions or amendments in the additional Local Rules published by The R&A, is in effect.

#### 8 Clubs and Balls

8a) List of Conforming Driver Heads: Model Local Rule G-1 is in effect.

Penalty for making a stroke with a club in breach of Local Rule: Disqualification.

8b) Groove and Punch Mark Specifications: Model Local Rule G-2 is in effect.

Penalty for making a stroke with a club in breach of Local Rule: Disqualification.

8c) List of Conforming Golf Balls: Model Local Rule G-3 is in effect.

Penalty for breach of the Local Rule: Disqualification.

## 9 Pace of Play (Rule 5.6)

Every Championship or Match has a Pace of Play Policy that will be strictly enforced. Please ensure you obtain a copy of the Pace of Play Policy and read it carefully before playing.

### 10 Suspension of Play (Rule 5.7)

The following signals will be used to suspend and resume play:

Immediate stop for imminent danger - one prolonged note of a siren

Stop for a non-dangerous situation - three consecutive notes of a siren

Resumption of play - two consecutive notes of a siren

**Note:** When play is stopped for imminent danger, all practice areas will be immediately closed.

# 11 Practice (Rule 5.2)

11a) In stroke play, Rule 5.2b is modified in this way: A player must not practise on the competition course before or between rounds.

11b) In match play, Rule 5.2a is modified in this way: A player must not practise on the competition course before or between rounds.

**Exception:** All recognised practice areas within the bounds of the course may be used by players for practice on any day of the competition.

## 12 Transportation

During a round, a player or caddie must not ride on any form of motorized transportation except as authorized or later approved by the Committee. A player who will play, or has played, under penalty of stroke and distance is always authorized to ride on motorized transportation. The player gets the general penalty for each hole during which there is a breach. A breach between two holes applies to the next hole.

# 13 Advice in Team Competitions (Rule 24)

Each team may name one advice giver whom players in the team may ask for advice and receive advice from during the round. The team must identify each advice giver to the Committee before any player on the team begins his or her round.

# 14 Eligibility

Players must meet the eligibility provisions established in the relevant Terms of Competition for the specific Championship or Match.

### 15 Anti-Doping

Players are required to comply with and be bound by any Anti-Doping Policy that is established for the Championship or Match in which they are playing, as detailed in the relevant Terms of Competition, as advised by prior notice or at the golf course.

# 16 Modification of Penalty Under Rule 3.3b(2) for Missing Player or Marker Certification Model Local Rule L-1 is in effect.

## 17 Returning of Scorecard

A player's scorecard is officially returned to the Committee when the player has left the recording office/area with both feet.

# **18 Deciding Ties**

The method for deciding ties is provided on the relevant entry form or is published at the golf course by The R&A.

# 19 Results of Match or Championship - Competition Closed

19a) Match Play

The result of a match is officially announced when it has been recorded in the Championship Office.

19b) Stroke Play

When the Championship trophy is presented to the winner, the results of the competition are officially announced, and the competition is closed.

**Exception:** Qualifying competitions for The Open – refer to the Committee.
